Legislative Biography



NH Rep. Len Turcotte is the Representative in the New Hampshire General Court who represents New Hampshire House Strafford 04 and received 17.0% of the vote in his last election. He is the Chair of the Municipal And County Government committee.

He works most frequently on Law (26 bills), Economics and Public Finance (18 bills), Civil Rights and Liberties, Minority Issues (17 bills), Labor and

Employment (16 bills), and Finance and Financial Sector (14 bills). He has sponsored 10 bills in his last thirteen year(s) in office, voting with his party 78.1% of the time, getting 70.0% of his bills out of committee, and 20.0% of his sponsored bills enacted.

Rep. Turcotte most frequently works on legislation with Gregory Hill (R-NH-106) (12 bills), James Spillane (R-NH-136) (9 bills), and Kevin Avard (R-NH-12) (9 bills). He most frequently votes with Diane Pauer (R-NH-95) (97.26%), Shane Sirois (R-NH-91) (96.35%), and Keith Erf (R-NH-87) (96.35%).

Before entering politics, Rep. Turcotte was involved in business. He received his undergraduate degree from the University of New Hampshire and an undergraduate degree from Portsmouth High School.

Other

Representative Turcotte was endorsed by the Koch-funded organization Americans for Prosperity. Americans for Prosperity-New Hampshire endorsed Representative Turcotte in 2022. According to the Center for Media and Democracy, Americans for Prosperity are a "right-wing political advocacy group founded by billionaire brothers David and Charles Koch, the owners of Koch Industries. AFP serves as the Kochs' 'grassroots' operation, also known as astroturf. AFP spends millions on TV ads in election cycles." As of 2023, AFP has 36 State Chapters with at least 250 staffers, and it boasts of 3.2 million activists participating in their ground force. "In the 2012 election cycle, it was a key component of the Kochs' \$400 million political network, receiving large portions of its money from Koch-linked dark money groups like Freedom Partners, American Encore, and Donors Trust. Representative Turcotte touted his vote against a bill enacting rent control. After the House rejected an effort to allow towns and cities to impose controls on rent increases and notices, Representative Turcotte pushed back on the idea of rent control, claiming it would distort "the free market." When one of his Democrat colleagues pointed out the soaring rates of rent in Concord, Representative Turcotte waved off the notion of soaring rates, claiming that would mean landlords "are colluding, and that is simply impossible."
